NY grant funds Cass Park updates

The Youth Bureau is excited to announce it has received a \$500,000 grant from the New York State Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation to build a new pavilion, bathroom, and handicapped parking at Cass Park.

The funds will pay for the replacement of the bathroom and pavilion near the Ithaca Children's Garden and Black Diamond trailhead and a oneway turnaround with ADA-accessible parking in that area.

The new bathroom will be ADA-accessible and gender-neutral. The pavilion will be replaced with a more open structure that has a hard-surface floor and may include solar-timed lighting.

An action-packed year for the College Discovery Program

IYB Rec celebrates success in 2023

IYB Recreation had an incredible year, bringing back a few more of the programs it offered before the 2020 global pandemic in addition to many that returned in 2021-2022.

The department offered a variety of opportunities including soccer, softball and

baseball, Tae Kwon Do, flag football, lacrosse, basketball, chess, yoga, along with art, theatre, and pottery classes. Public roller- and ice-skating sessions surged in popularity. In addition, the department received a \$1900 grant from the U.S. Tennis Association, which funded new equipment and instructor salaries.
