

Our Youth Bureau community was saddened to learn of the recent passing of Martha Schreurs-Bonjernoor. Martha and her late husband, Jan, created a fund in memory of their son, Paul, who passed away in a tragic accident while attending Cornell University. The fund was intended to provide educational opportunities for youth who, without assistance, might be unable to pursue their education beyond high school. That fund evolved into the Paul Schreurs Memorial Program (PSMP) which provides academic, personal, emotional, and social support by promoting relationships and offering programs that inspire underrepresented youth in our community to be successful confident life-long learners.
